2. Dear Friends

Since our last edition of *The Messenger* there has been some major progress in how we have been operating as the COVID-19 dust begins to settle. Most importantly of course, from Pentecost on the 23rd of May, our building has been open again for Sunday Worship after a period of 60 weeks. Broadcasting the service from the building and continuing our telephone service ensures there are options that allow everyone the opportunity to participate in a way that suits best.

Following my letter of 6th May and the feedback received, the IT equipment that was proposed has been purchased and will be installed soon. This will greatly enhance the quality of the broadcast that comes from the Church, improve the sound quality in the Church and create opportunities to develop the use of the building. It could also potentially enable us to share worship resources with congregations across the wider URC.

As organisations and groups look to restart in accordance with Government Guidelines, there is much excitement in The Murrayfield Club. I continue as acting chair of the Trustees and have been delighted to see that as part of our response to being unable to meet in person, the take up of our weekly Activity Packs has been well received by many members of Saughtonhall. Lesley and her staff team continue to do a great job. The development that is causing the excitement is that hopefully from September the Club will be opening a cafe in Saughtonhall on a Friday morning. Initially this will be open to Club members and members and friends from our three Murrayfield Churches Together congregations.

In my letter of 6th May I suggested that we took this opportunity of reopening to remind our neighbours of our presence. What can we as a local church offer our community in 2021 as we emerge in to a new way of being Church? A key part of this should be feelings of belonging and togetherness through a sense of God's presence and grace with family, friends, neighbours and strangers. Something many are seeking given the COVID 19 experience. This will only work if it is embraced and driven by you. I am happy to lead a strategy team in a process of discernment however, members and friends of all ages and stages need to be on board as we can all do something, no matter how small. If you would like to know more and perhaps even join the strategy team, please let me know - it's never too late. To get this moving we need a team, so please give this some prayerful consideration as we build on the spiritual and numerical growth we have witnessed in Saughtonhall since March 2020.
